

Registering Summit Products in the Windows Vista or Windows 7 Environment

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Introduction

There is only one issue that relates directly to Windows Vista and Windows 7 as opposed to Office. It is that after registering any Summit software, the software is unregistered when next opened.


Both of the following conditions must apply for Summit software to be successfully registered.

- 1. You must be logged on as a computer administrator.
- 2. You must have User Account Control turned off.


Following are detailed instructions for turning off User Account Control for Windows Vista and Windows 7.

Turning off User Account Control on Windows Vista

To turn off User Account Control take the following steps. Open the Control Panel and select User Accounts as shown below.



Select Turn User Account Control on or off as shown below.



Clear the Use User Account Control (UAC) check box to help protect your computer check box as shown below.



After clicking OK you may be asked to restart your computer. After restarting your computer, register your software.

After registering your software you can turn User Account Control back on.

Turning off User Account Control on Windows 7 To turn off User Account Control take the following steps

Click on User Account Control settings link.



Slide the slider bar to the lowest value (towards Never Notify), with description showing Never notify me.



Click OK to make the change effective.

Restart the computer to turn off User Access Control.

NOTE: You may need to restart your computer more than once.
